

WHY CHOOSE FOOTSCRAY HIGH SCHOOL?

We offer a supportive, multicultural environment where our international students are invited to make a cultural contribution. Many families choose to enrol their children at our school because of the presence of so many students from other cultures.

After completing time studying in a Footscray High School's English language centre, students integrate into our mainstream secondary school.

Extensive support services are available to our students so that they graduate and follow a future pathway of their choosing.

Our strong business and university links and community partners provide a unique range of opportunities and pathways that enrich student development with realworld experience and connectedness.

We currently accept international student enrolments in Years 7 to 12. We have welcomed students from all over the world.

Our international student program is valuable to our school's multicultural community. We have a range of programs specifically for international students, these include:

- an English language program
- a homework club
- a buddy program to support new international students
- an experienced international student team under the direct supervision of the principals
- an academic literacy program providing an extensive and diverse curriculum tailored to individual student needs.

Students are also able to study their first language as part of their Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE). Students can choose to enrol at the Victorian School of Languages where classes are held outside of normal school hours.

An academic program encouraging students to excel

At Footscray High School our Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) program fosters a dynamic and contemporary learning environment. This emphasises academic rigour, independence and challenges every student to achieve their personal best. Our students consistently attain high standards in academic pursuits and creative endeavours.

Through our extensive subject offerings, and our individualised approach to constructing student programs, we are able to tailor a specialised program for every student.

In 2020 and beyond, Footscray High School will continue to enrich and enhance the learning of high-ability students through a range of initiatives within and beyond the classroom.

An intensive extension course online

This is designed to target the academic needs of students who are in the early years of secondary school.

The course provides the opportunity for students with exceptional capabilities, skills and talents at all year levels to participate in events, workshops and programs run by expert partners and specialist practitioners.

The Footscray High School science, technology, engineering, arts and maths (STEAM) program – the overarching goal of this program is to provide students with skills that will help them thrive in the rapidly changing workplaces of the future.

Our ongoing work in developing these STEAM programs centres on developing skills for the future. Our programs are designed to develop students' ability to thrive when there is uncertainty. Thereby enabling, at the heart of every program, skills such as:

- problem solving
- communication
- critical thinking
- creativity
- personal and social skills
- decision making
- collaboration.





A variety of extra-curricular activities

A number of clubs and activities operate at lunchtimes or after school to cater for student's special interests. These include the Marie Curie girl's science club as well as a boys science club. Plus, several other clubs for chess, photography, debating, art and fashion, animation and the "caught read handed" reading club.

There is also the opportunity for students to train for and participate in the great Victorian bike ride as well as other sports training and in-house competitions.

In addition to the above there are further extracurricular programs that you can choose to become involved in including camps, excursions, annual musical and theatrical activities, lunchtime clubs and activities as well as a homework club.

Serious about student welfare

At Footscray High School we provide every support to ensure every student has a successful academic record. We also provide advice for tertiary studies.

We hold an orientation camp once a year to help students learn about the history and geography of Victoria and establish friendships. Our student welfare coordinator, school nurse and multicultural aides all cater for student welfare.

- a separate single room for your personal use
- three meals a day, seven days a week, including snacks
- facilities a bed, wardrobe, towels and linen
- utilities gas, electricity, heating and water costs, internet
- cleaning services of common living areas
- the use of living areas within the residence
- study facilities desk, study light, bookcase
- attendance at parent/teacher evenings on behalf of your parents.
